Chapter History

Hamilton Chapter Member: Frank J. Stempski – Historical Bio

Like many of the Chapter Members featured in these historical bios of Hamilton Chapter Members, Frank also served at one time as President of the Hamilton Chapter. He served in this position in the '97- '98 chapter year after. Frank also served on a number of other committees over the past 10 years - as Membership Chair, Program Chair and Research Promotion Chair.

Frank has been in the HVAC business for more than thirty years. It all stated at Emco Supply in 1970 where he got interested in the HVAC industry. In 1975, Frank accepted a position with Niagara Plumbing Supply where he was mentored by Mr. Bert Corkum who is now deceased. Bert helped develop Frank's skills in the world of hydronics. This launched Frank into many opportunities. He started designing systems for residential homes and detailed the contract so it could be quoted by a number of contractors. Gaining confidence, Frank moved up into the design of commercial buildings and multistory apartment complexes.

In 1985, Frank moved to the Greenhouse Division at Niagara which was known as Niagrow Systems. This was an area of new growth in the Niagara Peninsula. Farmers and developers needed energy efficient facilities for growing plants for the consumers market that were cost competitive with other areas in the province. Given the challenge, Frank studied European methods used to heat greenhouses and then combined a low-pressure steam systems with some modern concepts in hydronics to configure the first hybrid heating system for use in a commercial greenhouse. This design proved to be very efficient and is still widely accepted today some 15 years later. As one drives down the QEW, you can see the evidence of a very active and profitable greenhouse industry to which Frank was a major contributor.

Looking for new challenges, in 1991, Frank joined Aqua Tech Sales, moving away from design into the more dynamic sales marketing and management phase of our business. In 1992, Frank joined the ASHRAE Hamilton Chapter and volunteered to be on the Chapter Membership Committee. Soon he was Chair and went on to be Chapter President in 1997.

Frank is currently on the TC for the new CSA B 214 – Canadian Hydronics Code. Frank was past Chairman of the Canadian Greenhouse Conference. He is now touring the country conducting hydronics seminars and teaching hydronics in various schools. The Hamilton Chapter membership always looks forward to Frank's participation and positive outlook at many of the special functions and Chapter Meetings. His company has been and continues to be a strong supporter of the chapter. We look forward to Frank being active in ASHRAE for many more years.

- Mohawk College, Fennell Campus is on your right at the first stop light on Governor's Blvd.


From points west (London):

- exit at the Lincoln Alexander Expressway (the LINC) and go east
- exit at Garth Street and turn left (north) (follow the signs for Mohawk College)
- turn right (east) onto Fennell Avenue
- Mohawk College, Fennell Campus is on your right at the first stoplight at Governor's Blvd.

From points south (Niagara)

- QEW West to Hamilton
- exit at Centennial Parkway (Hwy #20) and go left (south)
- come up the "mountain" and turn right (west) on Mud Street; this becomes the Lincoln Alexander Expressway (the LINC)
- exit at Upper James Street and turn right (north)
- turn left (west) on Mohawk Road
- turn right (north) on West 5th St.
- Mohawk College, Fennell Campus is on your left just past the first stoplight
