Canada currently has a 6.4 energy use index per capita use — the highest in the OECD (Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development). The City of Guelph's "Community Energy Plan" hopes to reduce the city's energy index to that of Sweden which is 3.5.

After the luncheon, and before the Castle tour, two awards in total were handed out. The recipients in attendance were Leon Yaskowich and Bob Schock, who received their 50 year memberships. Two other award recipients that were not able to attend were John Pollock and Peter Graham, for their Life Member awards.

The tour was really interesting and managed to touch on the HVAC field a bit where we looked at a 30 foot deep pit inside the castle that was filled with snow and used as a means of refrigerating the food for the people that occupied the castle. The servants would fill the pit with snow, leaves, and straw, and would last long enough to make it through the Fall each year, before it was filled again the following Winter. Also, Dundurn was one of the first residences at that time that use gaslights. The gas was available from the coal that was also used for heating inside the castle.

For the first meeting of the new year, we'll be discussing the changes to recent Gas Codes, from a representative from the TSSA. Also, the feature speaker topic will cover the City of Guelph's new Plan for Sustainability.
