#### **Proving It's Green, Keeping It Green**

The move towards a better built environment was started with the initial energy crisis in the 1973. Over the last four decades, this evolution was driven by improved architectural, mechanical, and electrical design concepts. Starting in the early 80s, the commissioning process for HVAC systems was developed by ASHRAE and the guideline was published in 1989. Lately, with the added benefit of renewable energy sources, the complexity of the building and its systems has risen to an extremely high level. Therefore, the confirmation that the total building is performing to the design intent, that the technology transfers from the two dimensional design to the three dimensional real world, and that the assurance that this will continue to operate as intended through-out the life cycle of the building, is imperative. The presentation will demonstrate the necessary steps required to accomplish these objectives.
